AWARDS

Two awards ceremonies will take place in Cameron Indoor Arena during the championships. The first will occur Friday, March 24, after the men's individual weapon championship bouts. The second will occur on Sunday, March 26, after the women's individual weapon championship bouts. Team awards will also be presented to the top four institutions following the women's individual awards.

Both awards presentations will include presenting mini-trophies to the top-eight finishers in each weapon.

If an institution finishes in the top-four of the team competition, all travel party members are welcome to take part in the awards ceremony, if desired.

Fencers taking part in any portion of the awards presentation shall dress in their **school's official team warm-up attire/uniform**. This is especially important, as they will be broadcast on ESPN. Please assist host staff/the fencing committee by instructing your student-athletes to be prepared to report to the staging area prior to the end of the last bout, so the ceremony can be conducted as soon as possible.

COACHES MEETING

One mandatory coaches meeting will be held prior to the championships. The meeting will be held virtually, via a Microsoft Teams meeting. The meeting will be held at **1 p.m. eastern time on Friday, March 17**.

A meeting invitation will be sent to all head coaches with a link to join this meeting.

This is a mandatory meeting for all head coaches. Administrators and athletic trainers are also welcome to join. If there are circumstances that will not permit a member of your coaching or administrative staff to be a part of this meeting, please contact Zach Christopher at zchristopher@ncaa.org.

DRUG TESTING

Drug testing may occur at any session of the championships. If this occurs, a representative of the student-athletes institution will make contact in the locker room with the selected student-athletes immediately following the conclusion of the 10-minute cooling off period. After signing the notification form, student-athletes have one hour to report to the testing site; they should participate in the post-match interview sessions (if selected) before reporting to the testing site. Players from either winning or losing team may be tested. If testing is conducted, two separate testing areas will be provided.



ESPN

ESPN will once again be broadcasting all of the semi-final and championship bouts live on ESPN+.

An ESPN representative may request an interview with you, or one of your student-athletes during the competition. Please be prepared for this. All requests will initially be directed towards a member of the coaching staff.

The semi-finals and finals, along with a championship recap, will air on ESPNU on April 6 at 2 p.m. Eastern time.

ELITE 90

The Elite 90 award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average competing at the final site for each of the 90 NCAA championships. Each institution that has at least one student-athlete qualify for the final round site is eligible to nominate a student-athlete for the award. All ties are broken by the number of credits completed.

HOSPITALITY

Student-Athlete Hospitality for competing student-athletes (Men on Thursday and Friday, Women on Saturday and Sunday) will be available throughout the championship in the Cragg Family Room, located on court level off the competition floor. Seating will be provided within the hospitality area for student-athletes to enjoy their meal. Coolers of water or PowerAde will be available throughout the venue to refill squeeze bottles.

For teams wishing to purchase grab-n-go meals for non-competing student-athletes on the opposite gender's competition day, please contact Jane Garland with Trident Provisions at jgarland@tridentprov.com prior to the start of the championship for purchase.

Team personnel hospitality will be located in the Champions Club on the concourse Level behind Sections 2 and 3 and will consist of light breakfast items and lunches. Seating is provided within the hospitality area.

If the NCAA and hotel are not made aware of your plans to stay at another location, your institution **WILL** be responsible for the cost of the minimum amount of rooms your institution would have used at the hotel.

STUDENT-ATHLETE EQUIPMENT AREA/PRACTICE STRIPS

A student-athlete equipment area will be set-up on the concourse level on the west side of the venue along the Hall of Honor. This area is located immediately inside the team entrance. Please note that this area is not on the same level as the armorer or competition floor. Areas will be labeled for each institution. Student-athletes will be permitted to leave their items in their designated equipment area overnight, as the venue will be locked and secure following competition each night. Restrooms for student-athletes and team personnel in this area will be mixed with spectator use.

In-venue locker room facilities will be provided off the competition floor for competing student-athletes on their gender's competition days (men on Thursday and Friday, women on Saturday and Sunday). A gender-neutral locker room option will be available for competing student-athletes throughout competition. Locker room facilities for the non-competing student-athletes will be available in Koskinen Stadium, adjacent to Cameron Indoor Stadium. Staff will be available at the practice strips and near the equipment area to assist with escorts to/from these spaces.

Restrooms for student-athletes and team personnel will be available on court level in addition to within the locker room space.

Practice strips will be available in Card Gymnasium. Card Gym can be access through the tunnel in the Northeast Corner of competition floor. Equipment should NOT be left in the warm-up area overnight.

Directional signage and staff will be present to direct team personnel to all locations.

PARKING and ENTRANCE

Team parking is located in the Whitford Parking Lot at **110 Whitford Drive, Durham NC 27708**. Team drop-off is located at Whitford Circle immediately outside the parking lot entrance.

All participants with credentials will use the doors at the South Hall of Honor Entrance their main entrance to the facility.

The semi-finals and finals will be streamed on ESPN+.

MEDICAL INFORMATION

On behalf of Duke Athletic Medicine, I would like to welcome you to Duke University and Cameron Indoor Stadium for the 2023 NCAA Fencing Championships. There will be a satellite athletic training room located adjacent to the competition floor in Cameron Indoor Stadium during the event.

The following modalities will be available for your use in the Cameron Athletic Training space if needed:

- Hydrocollator
- Electrical stimulation
- Ultrasound
- First aid supplies

A Certified Athletic Trainer will be present at all practices and competitions. A team physician will also be on call or present for the entirety of the Championship event. If your team is traveling without an athletic trainer, please provide documentation for any pre-existing medical conditions (sickle cell, diabetes, etc.), as well any information to be used in event of an emergency (emergency contacts and insurance

information). We ask you please notify us in advance with any specific instructions for necessary treatments your athletes may require, so that we can provide the best possible medical care for your student-athletes during their visit.

Lastly, EMS will be on site for all competition. An EAP may be located in the Championship Manual.

- Water / Powerade and cups
- Fueling stations provided by Sports Nutrition
- Injury ice & ice bags

EMERGENCY ACTION PLAN ~CAMERON INDOOR STADIUM

Full text of the 2023 National Collegiate Fencing Championship Operations Plan will be available to all teams and administrators.

MEDICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

On-Site Medical Personnel will consist of:

- Certified Athletic Trainers on-site for practices and competition at competition area and warm-up strips
- Sports Medicine Physicians on-site for competition; on-call for practices
- Duke Life Flight Event Medicine Paramedics on site for competition

Emergency Equipment will consist of:

- All on-site personnel will carry standard medical equipment, kits & supplies per their position.
- AED, Medical Kit, Orthopaedic Splints, Crutches, Spine Board present at competition strips and warm-up strips
- ALS Ambulance on Site

In the event of a competition or warm-up area incident:

- Duke Athletic Medicine will handle the immediate care of the injured/ill student-athlete or participant. Duke Game Operations staff will assist as directed.
- In the event of activation of the emergency medical system:
 - o Duke Game Operations will retrieve on-site Duke Life Flight EMS and provide specific information about patient condition and treatment given.
 - o Duke Game Operations and Event Staff will provide scene control to limit the scene to medical providers.
 - o The decision to transport the student-athlete will be made by Duke Athletic Medicine and Duke Life Flight EMS.
 - o In the event of a transport via ambulance to Duke Hospital, Duke Game Operations and Event Staff will provide a clear, direct path to the ambulance and expedite egress.
- If additional resources are required, the county 9-1-1 system will be used to call Durham County EMS for transport. The ambulance will be directed to **110 Whitford Drive or 320 Towerview**



Road (depending on the patient's location). Duke Game Operations will meet the ambulance and direct ingress to the patient's location in the venue.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

Events during the Championship will be monitored and directed by the Host Championship Director (Greg Pierce) who will be continuously roaming around Cameron Indoor Stadium and Card Gymnasium. The Host Championship Director will monitor the weather, social media, venue text messaging, and DukeALERT text messaging throughout the Championship.

Upon notification of a potential emergency situation, the Emergency Response Team will assemble in the Champions Club or Scharf Hall (depending on the location and nature of the emergency). The Emergency Response Team will consist of

- Duke Athletics Senior Staff – Becca Wilusz
- Duke Championship Media Coordinator – Sarah Leggett
- Duke University Police
- Duke University Emergency Manager (or designee)
- Duke Athletics Executive Senior Staff – Bob Weiseman (or designee)
- NCAA Championship Director – Zach Christopher
- NCAA Committee

The Emergency Response Team will determine whether the potential situation merits evacuation of Cameron Indoor Stadium or Card Gymnasium. The Host Tournament Director will direct evacuation of the venue based on the specific scenario and circumstances.

If the decision is made to delay or suspend competition and time permits, the NCAA Championship Director and Duke Game Operations will notify teams, officials, and television of the decision prior to public announcement.

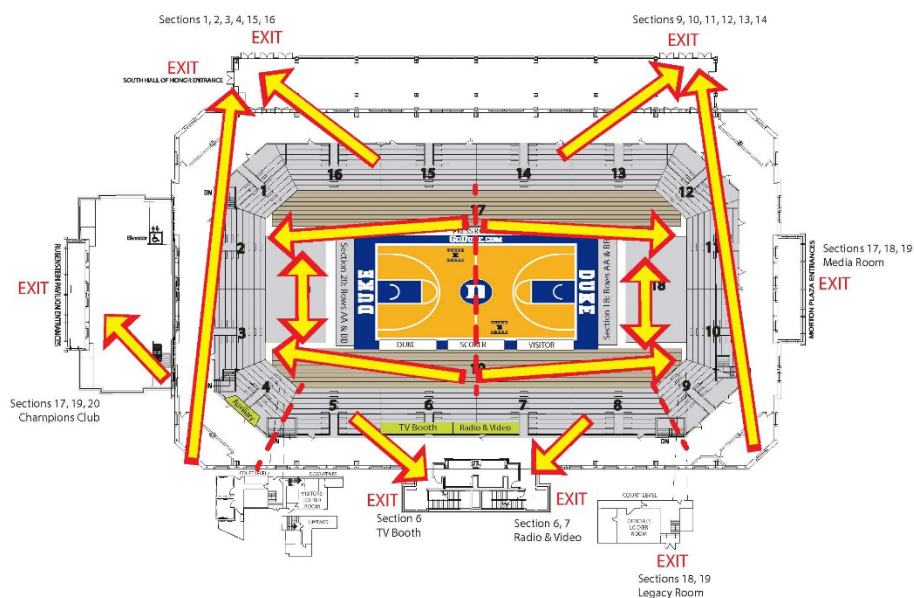
Resumption of competition, warm-up time, and adjustment of the remaining event schedule will be determined by the NCAA Championship Director and communicated to teams, officials, television, and guests.

Designated Primary Shelter Locations:

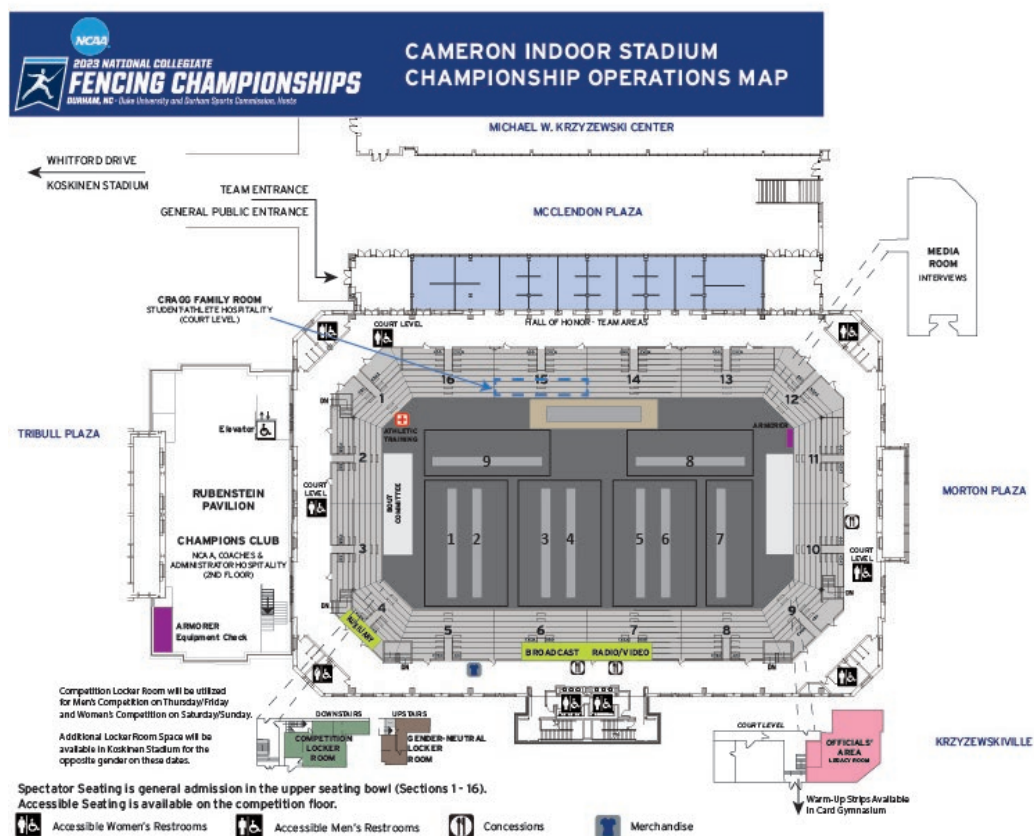

PARKING MAP

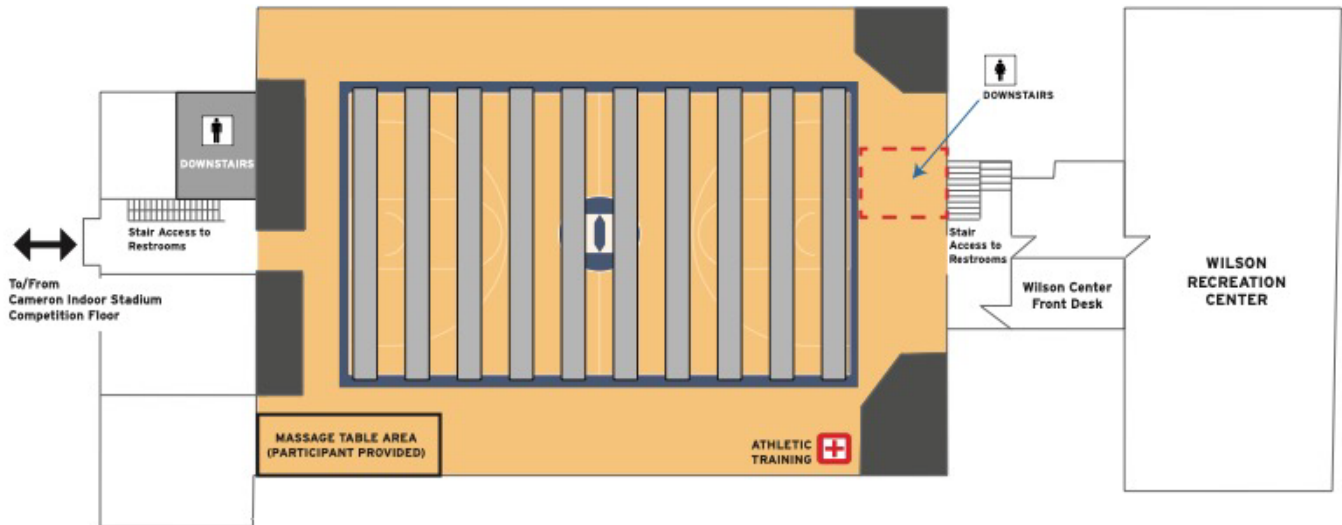


FACILITY DIAGRAMS
